* UTC and leap seconds: this standing issue (see in http://www.bipm.org/IAU31/activities)

has still no clear outcome in view.

- * UTC(k): A new recommendation specifies which institution may use this conventional nomenclature.
- * Application of IAU Resolutions (2000): There are no practical implications yet but the BIPM is asked to follow the developments in clock performance and study appropriate action, if required.
