1)Election of officers for the triennium 2003-2006

For 2003-2006, the present vice-president D.N. Matsakis will be president of Commission 31.

For the future vice president, one candidate has been proposed and has agreed to serve: Dr Pascale Defraigne from the Royal Observatory of Belgium. She is well known for her research activities on time transfer, Earth tides and nutation. Because she is the only candidate who accepted the nomination, I think there is no problem to consider that she is designated as the next vice president. Please let me know by 10 March 2003 if you see an objection to this procedure.
