IGO: progress of negotiations

- Convention documents and Final Record now agreed
- Italian presidency opened the documents for initialing last week
- Formal signing in Rome in September/October: Ministerial level
- Convention into force when 5 countries ratify
- Cabinet approval needed to sign Convention and release NISA funds







Pre-construction

- Design phase for SKA: international consortia
- Consortia moving to Critical Design Reviews
 - System CDR expected early 2019
- CSIRO contributions well received:
 - Central Signal Processing conditionally passed sub-element CDR
 - Infrastructure Australia passed readiness review, all documents submitted
 - Signal and Data Transport conditionally passed CDR



Bridging


- Consortia will be dissolved after their CDRs
- Significant work still to be done for system CDR and towards construction tenders
- SKAO proposed 'bridging' period
 - Identified staff to work with SKAO directly
 - Still some negotiation to take place on this
- Will request funding from DIIS
 - For SKAO requirements, and other Australian requirements



Early production array







- Build 4-6 SKA Low stations and associated signal chain
- Major de-risking exercise
 - Antenna testing
 - Interfaces
- Discussed at SKA Board
 - Concerns from Italy, Netherlands, Canada, UK
 - Prefer to start once IGO is established
- Looking at models to start infrastructure early



Construction planning

- SKAO circulated request for information to member countries
- Identify areas of interest for construction
- DIIS prepared Australia response
 - Consulted with CSIRO, ICRAR, Swinburne, WA Gov, Geraldton industry
- Potential CSIRO key roles:
 - Overall management of SKA Low assembly and integration
 - Leadership of **SKA Low infrastructure**
 - Leading correlator and beamformer construction for SKA Low

- Site entity Responsible for Australian site
- Key agreements
 - Lease
 - Site Entity contract
 - Collaboration Agreement between WA gov and DIIS
 - Hosting Agreement
 - ILUA









SKA Operations partner

- Operations review proposed a new model
- Face to face discussions early June









Australian SKA Regional Centre

- Members will establish SKA Regional Centres to help support SKA science.
- Provide processing, storage, user support etc.
- Collaborative work with ICRAR
 - Joint workshop in November to establish science requirements
 - Two joint workshops with industry Perth and Sydney
 - Technical 'hackathon' in Shanghai in April
 - Focus on needs of ASKAP and MWA initially
 - Technical work Rialto
- Small management committee established
 - Chaired by UWA/ICRAR
 - Members CSIRO, ICRAR, ASKAP, MWA, Pawsey
