- Finalised last week!
- Expands observatory
- Allows for SKA-Low construction
- Provides intergenerational benefits to Wajarri People, financial and non-financial

Publication acknowledgements

- Publication acknowledgements for Murchison-based telescopes will need to be updated due to new language from the 2022 Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA), including the new dual name.
- Will remain very similar to current acknowledgement texts with the addition of about 7-8 words.
- ILUA required text:
- "This scientific work uses data obtained from Inyarrimanha Ilgari Bundara / the Murchison Radio-astronomy Observatory. We acknowledge the Wajarri Yamaji People as the Traditional Owners and native title holders of the Observatory site."
