

North of 55 degrees, beyond the treeline



- ~500,000 km²,
 14,000 people,
 14 communities
- Unique way of life, culture and language
- Complex history with Canada and Québec

No roads, no trains, no buses



- Everything is transported by air (or boat)
- Subsidies:
 - Food
 - Housing
 - Heating
 - Airfares
 - Education
 - Gasoline

A vital lifeline by air



- 36 fleet aircraft
- 1,000 employees
- 21 destinations



Landing on a thousand metres of gravel



- No AWOS, paved runways, or ATC

- All communities serviced 7 days a week
